The biggest accomplishment for Luke's House this year is the expansion of the Edna Pilsbury Health Center. We moved our clinic operations from the shotgun space to a newly renovated, professional clinic space with twelve exam rooms!

Soon after, Alison joined the staff team to spearhead health education and public health programming. She will focus on diabetes, hypertension, nutrition, gardening, and support groups. Additionally, she will serve as the program manager for Street Medicine.

In our shotgun house, Recirculating Farms Coalition, one of our community partners installed a garden! This garden will be integrated into the nutrition education courses that will take place in our old space.

Asylum clinic is our most recent clinical service that provides asylum-seekers with supporting evaluations for their legal cases.

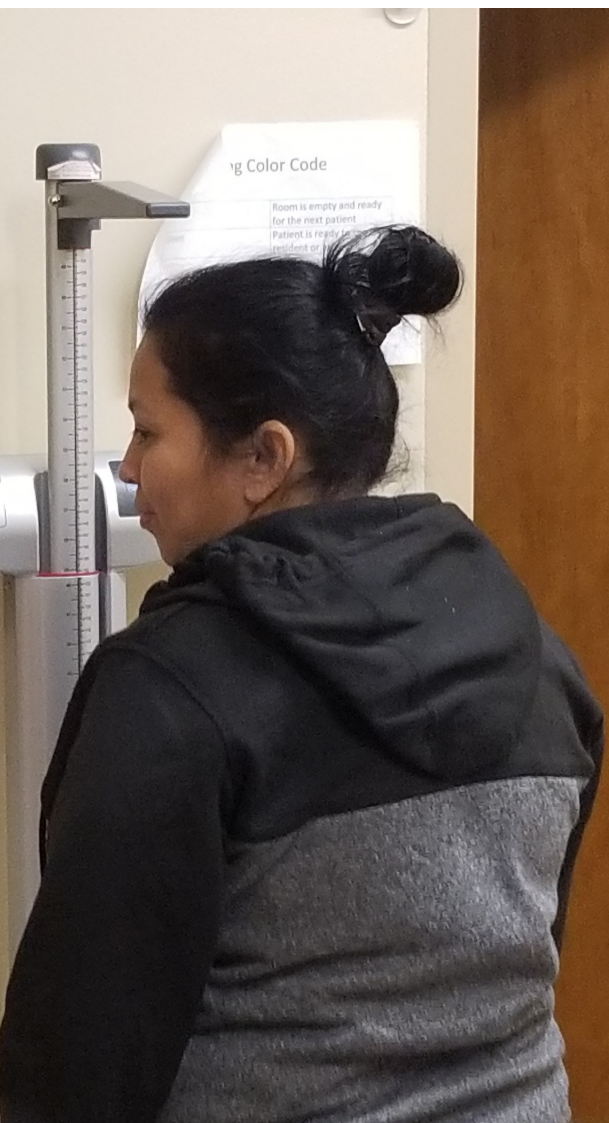
