FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear faithful supporter of Luke's House,

2018 was a profound year at Luke's House. After eleven years of serving in the community, we finally moved into a proper, fully renovated medical clinic. As many of you may know, when our doors first opened in November of 2007, we were located in the fellowship hall of Mt. Zion United Methodist Church. We outgrew that space in 2012 when we moved to 2023 Simon Bolivar Ave, the shotgun house that serves as the logo for Luke's House. But after several years in that space, our expansion of services to include street medicine, women's clinic, eye clinic, and health education programming meant we needed a new space. The 4,500 square foot facility at the Edna Pilsbury Building on 2222 Simon Bolivar Ave was just that space, and if you haven't seen it, come check it out. It's a beautiful space with plenty of exam rooms and health education programming space that allow us to have multiple providers practicing at the same time.

I want to give a special thanks to our patients and community members for being patient with us during the couple of weeks of the move and a big thank you to our Board of Directors for helping with the search and lease of the space.

We provided care to 846 people in 2018, the highest number of people served in our history. As we continue to grow and impact the lives of our community members, I am continually humbled by the generous support of our volunteers, community members, and donors. None of the work that we do would be possible without the passion you all have for making New Orleans a healthier place to live. Thank you, and I look forward to continuing to serve the community with you.

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WHAT WE DO

MEDICAL CLINICS AND SERVICES

General Clinic

On Tuesday and Thursday evenings the clinic provides general care services for adults and children, including school and work physicals, tetanus and flu vaccines, blood pressure and blood sugar checks.

GYN Clinic

Focused on gynecological health, breast health, prevention of mother-to-child transmission of HIV/AIDS and other STDs, family planning, nutritional support and education, and routine PAP smears.

Vision Clinic

Free eye exams and glasses.

Street Medicine

Street medicine provides check-ups in the street to people living in the streets.

Asylum Clinic

Clinical evaluations of asylum-seekers are performed to provide forensic evidence regarding an asylum-seeker's legal case. People who receive forensic evaluations are 66% more likely to be granted asylum.

Prescription Assistance

Our prescription assistance program provides our patients with a free one-month supply of medications.

Patient Navigation


Help assist patients establish primary care, specialty care, social services, and financial assistance or insurance.


